
Here are caterpillars hanging off twigs. These caterpillars are looking for good leaves to eat. Look at the patterns on their backs.




This yellow and black caterpillar has stripes. It has found a yummy meal. It munches and crunches on the green leaf. A caterpillar must eat a lot.

the moss and the slime.




Look at the stripe along this caterpillar. It has dots and spots all over it. These patterns make it difficult to see this caterpillar. It can hide on plants.




There is a very little caterpillar! It is inching along the rocks. It is bright yellow, like a banana.


Birds might think that they will get sick if they eat it.



Is it a cactus? No, it is a caterpillar! Caterpillars can look very cool. This caterpillar has spines shooting from its yellow spots.




This fuzzy caterpillar

Caterpillars come in all colors, shapes, and sizes. You can try to find caterpillars next time you are in a park.




