



Kitten Phyu Wah and the Bully



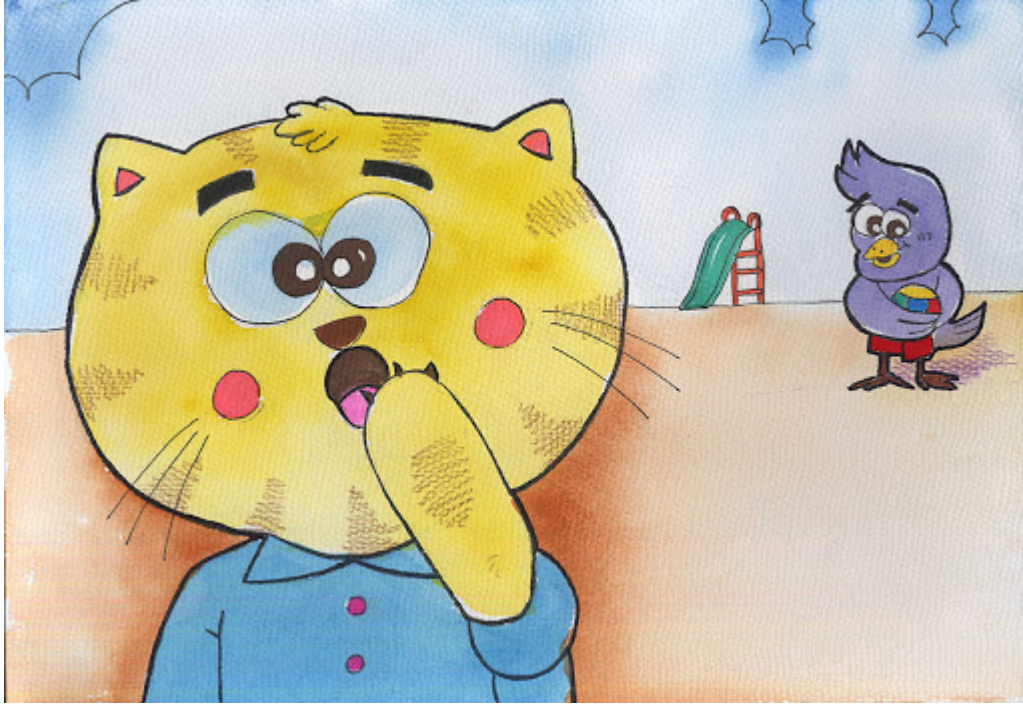
Kitten Phyu Wah hated walking to school. The big brown cat was always waiting to grab her lunch box.



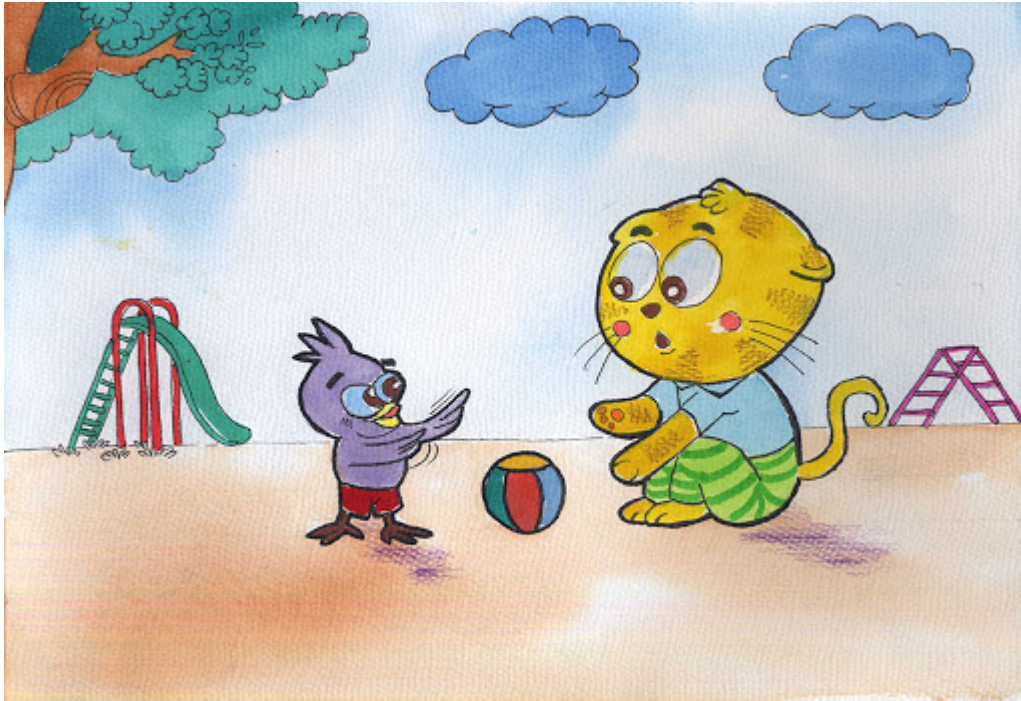
Sitting at the park, Phyu Wah wondered how she could get rid of the big brown cat.



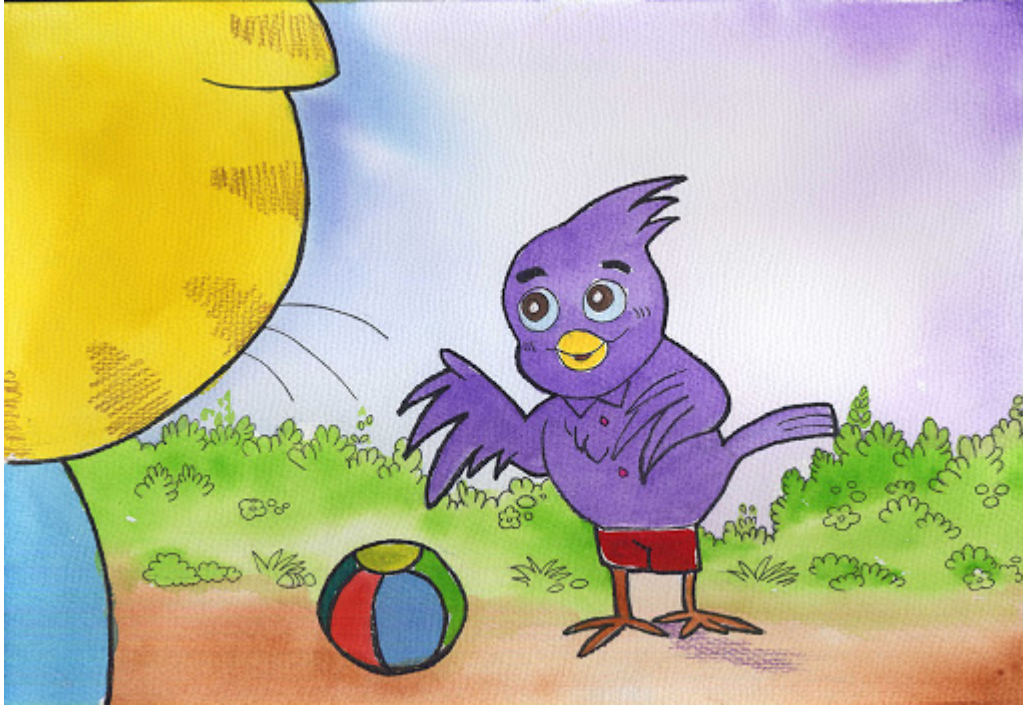
Then, right in front of her, a pigeon stole a ball from a sparrow. The sparrow bravely yelled at the pigeon, who dropped the ball and flew away.

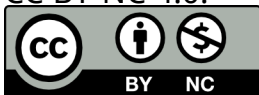
