feet.



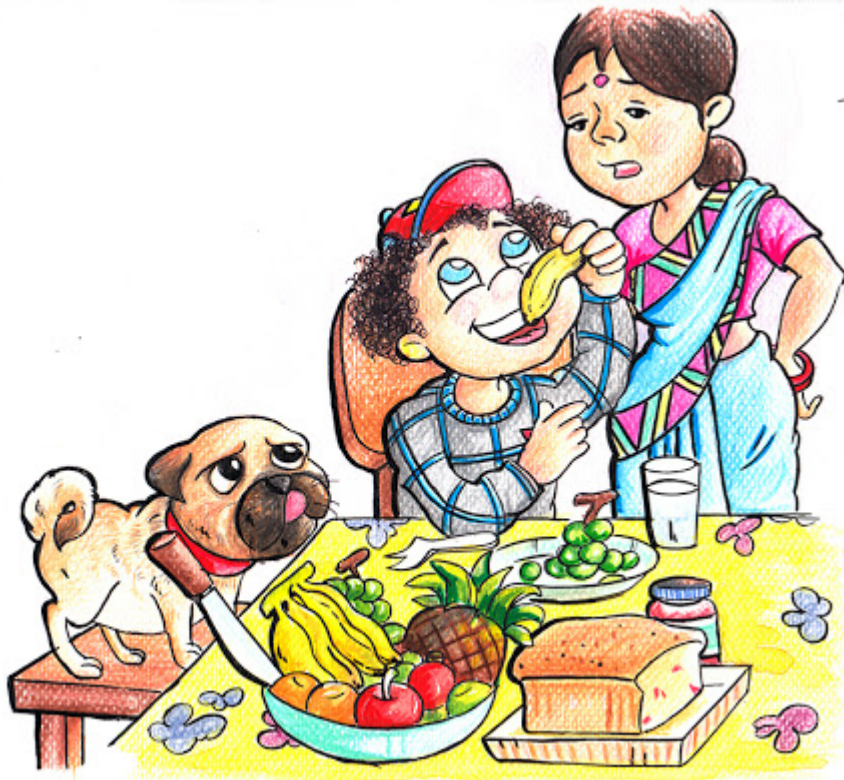
Today, I will do everything opposite.
