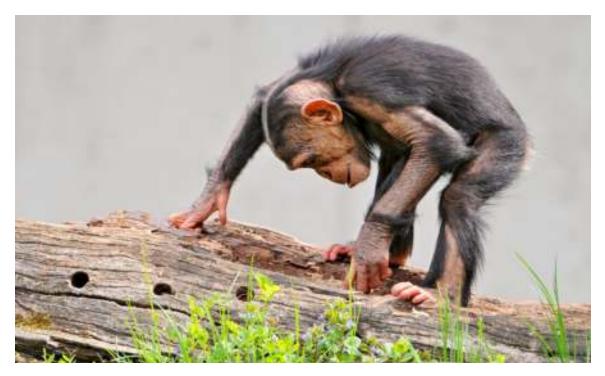
## Hungry Chimp

Little Chimp started to get hungry. He looked in a log to find some bugs to eat — no luck.

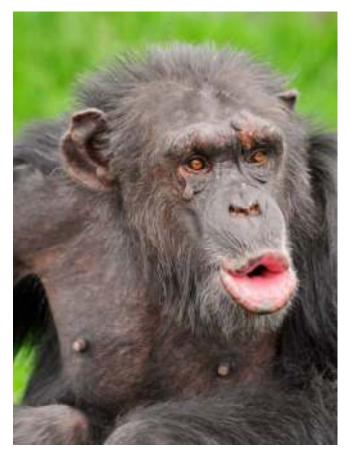


Little Chimp said, "Here is something to eat."
