



... a Barking Deer running away.


Sarak, sarak, sarak, sarak.

... a Capped Langur jumping from one tree to the other.






A little ahead, Hiren heard something.

Sring, sring, sring,


What was that?

Sring, sring, sring.




Relieved, Hiren walked on until he was near the camp.




What was that?
