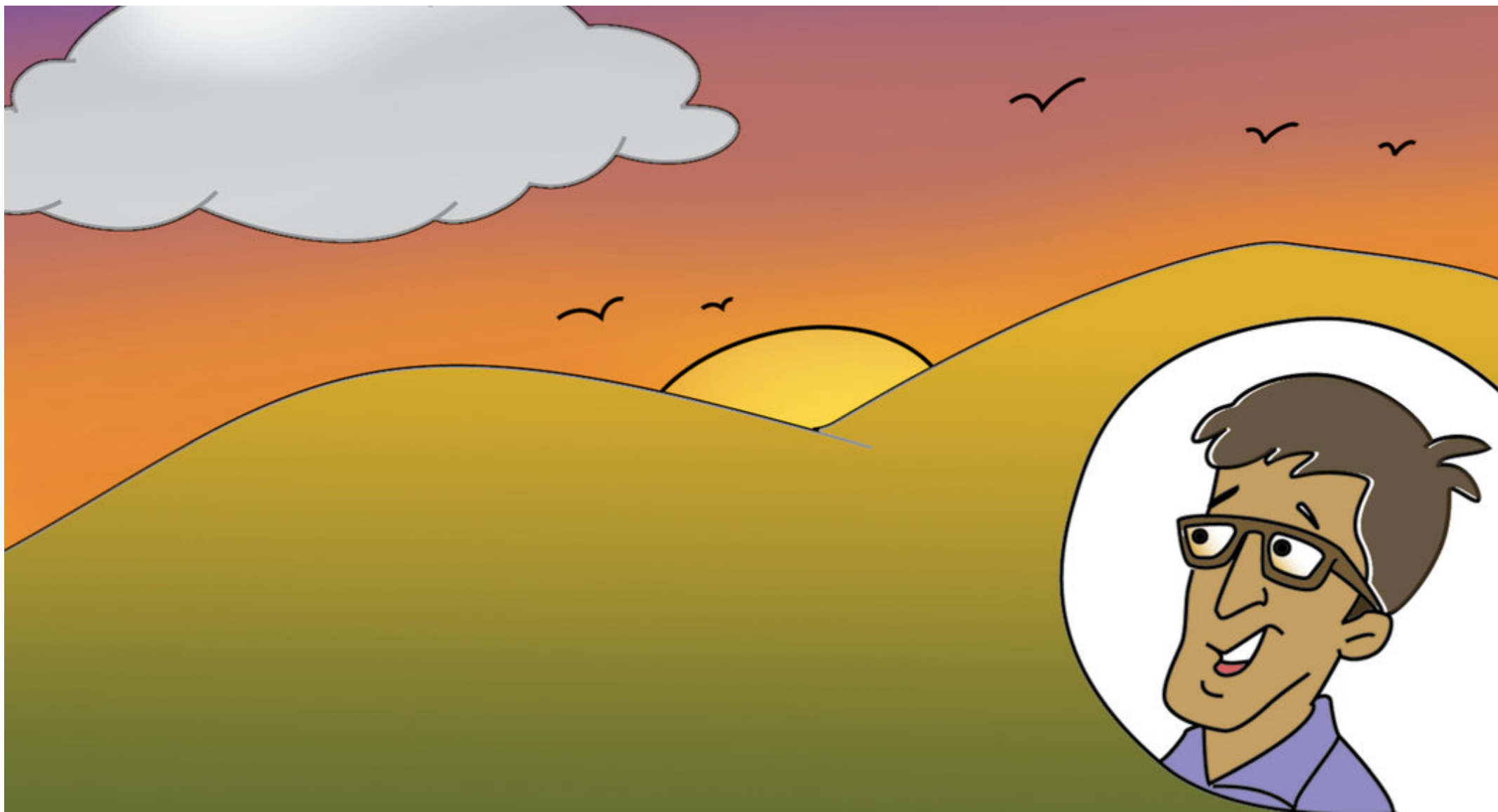

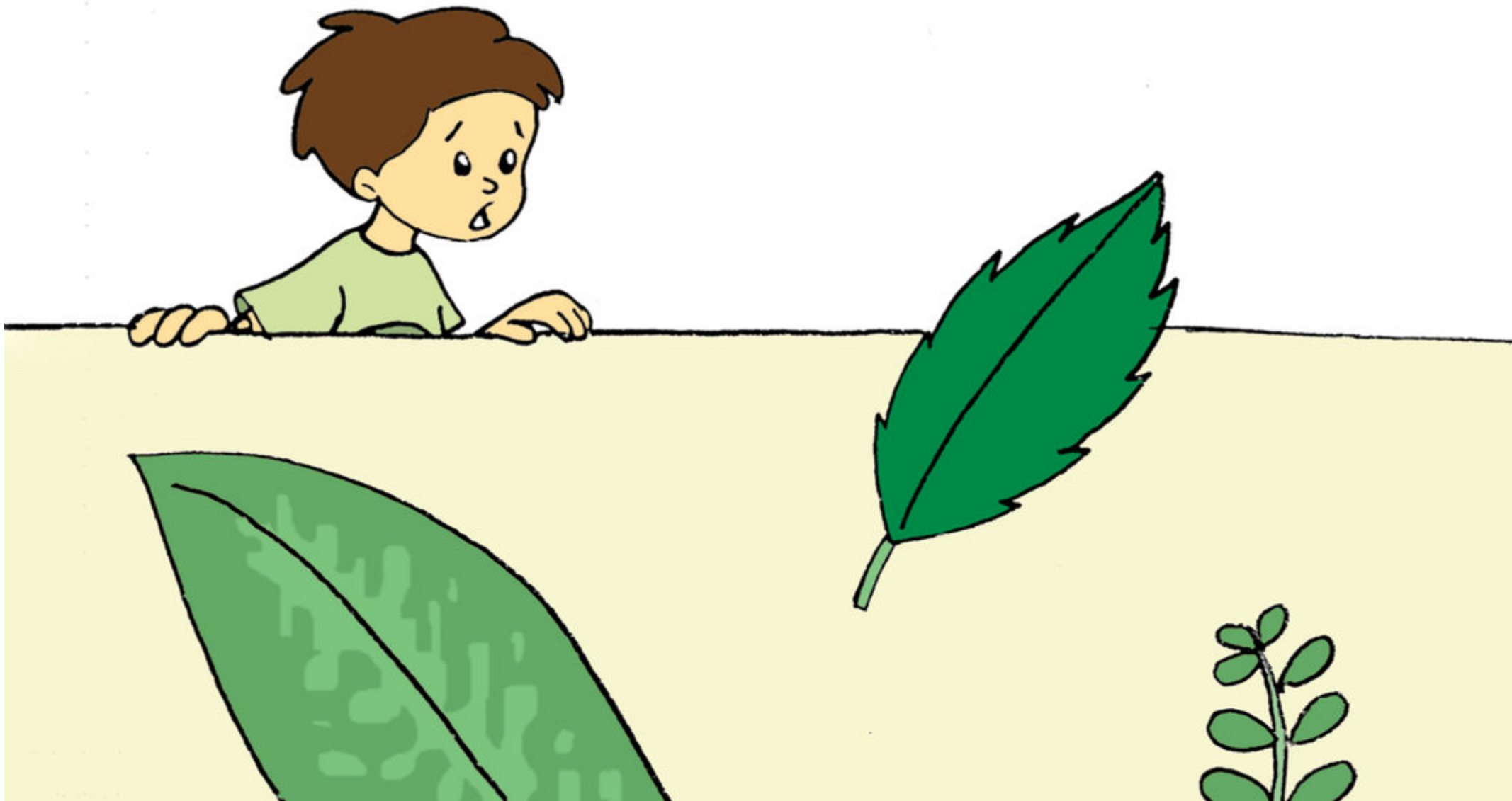

Why are leaves green?



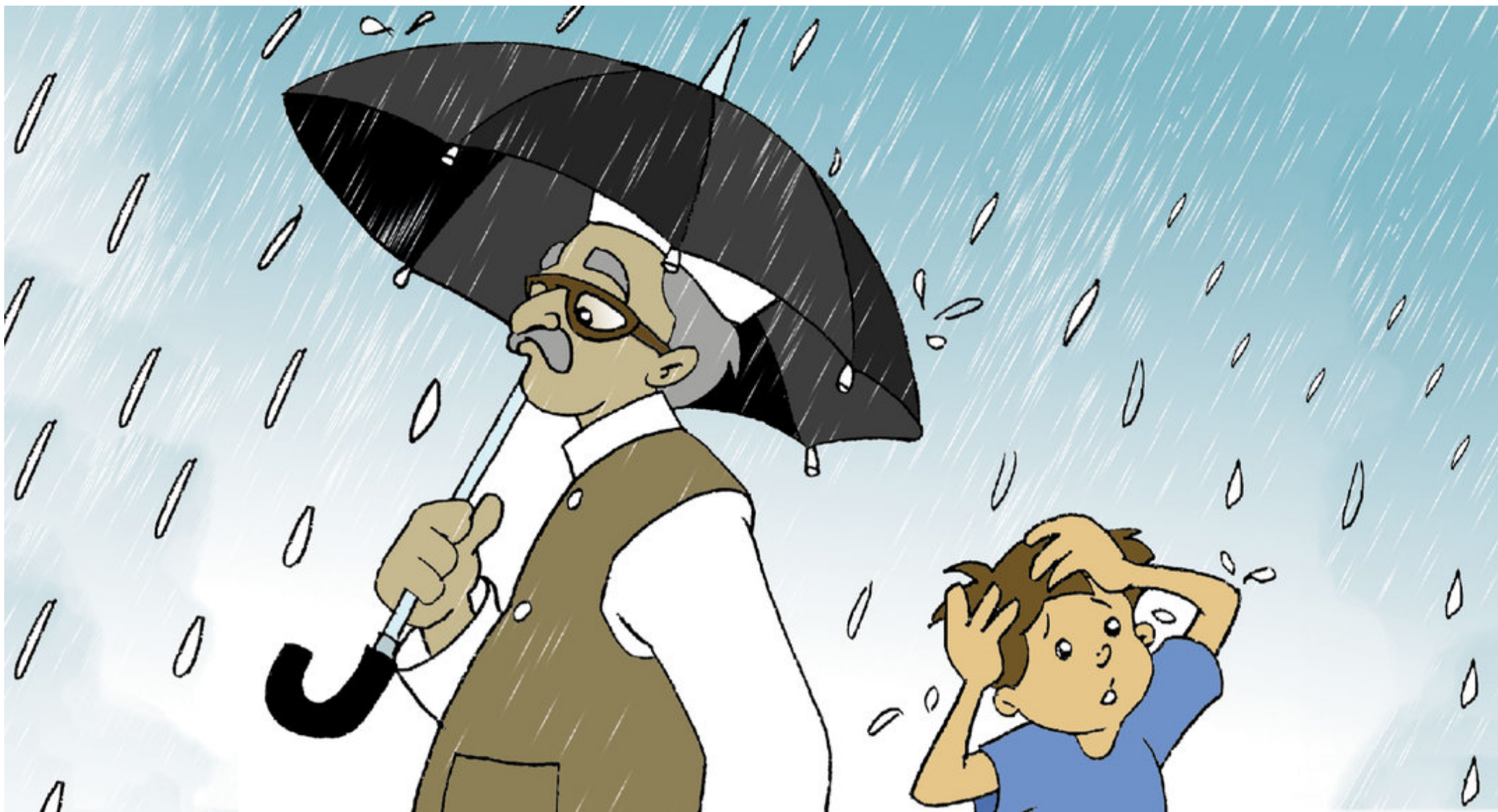
They are not always green. Are they?

Ripe bananas are yellow. Raw bananas are green.



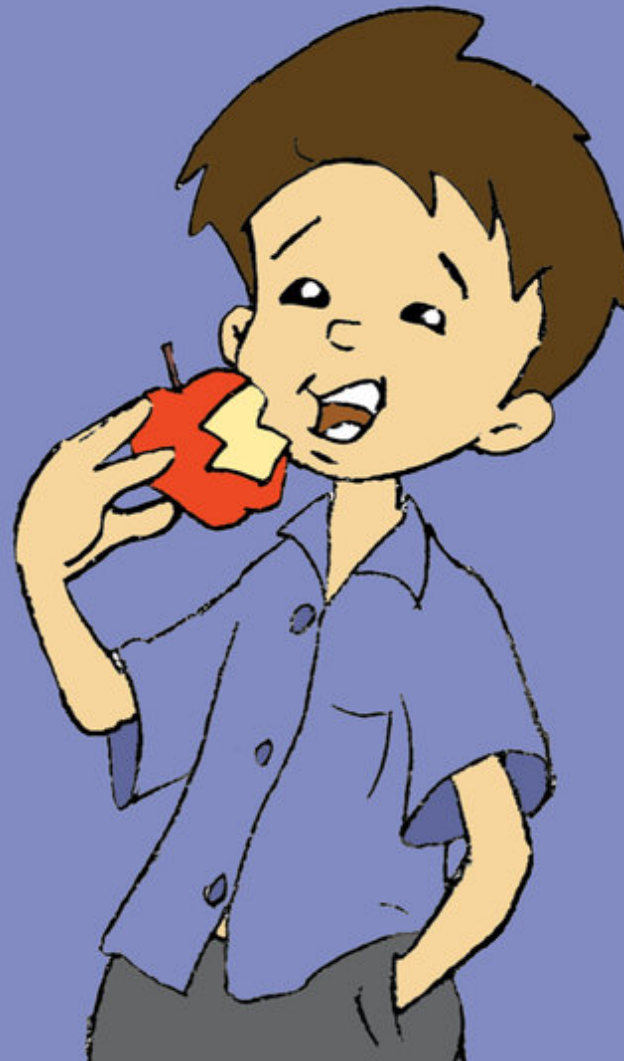
Why are umbrellas black?
