

Rat loves to play outside.




Today he wants to play Moek (hopscotch), but there is nobody to play with.




"I have an idea," he thinks.

"Brother Goat!" Rat exclaims. "Come play with me!"




"No, no!" Goat says. "I need to sleep. I don't want to play."
