

His room is a **BIG** mess!




Where should Jami start lookingfor the ball?



Is the ball on his bed?










Is the ball on his desk?

No! The ball is not here, either!




Shaju, Mitu, and Emon shout. "We're bored. We don't want to wait anymore! Jami, we're leaving!"
