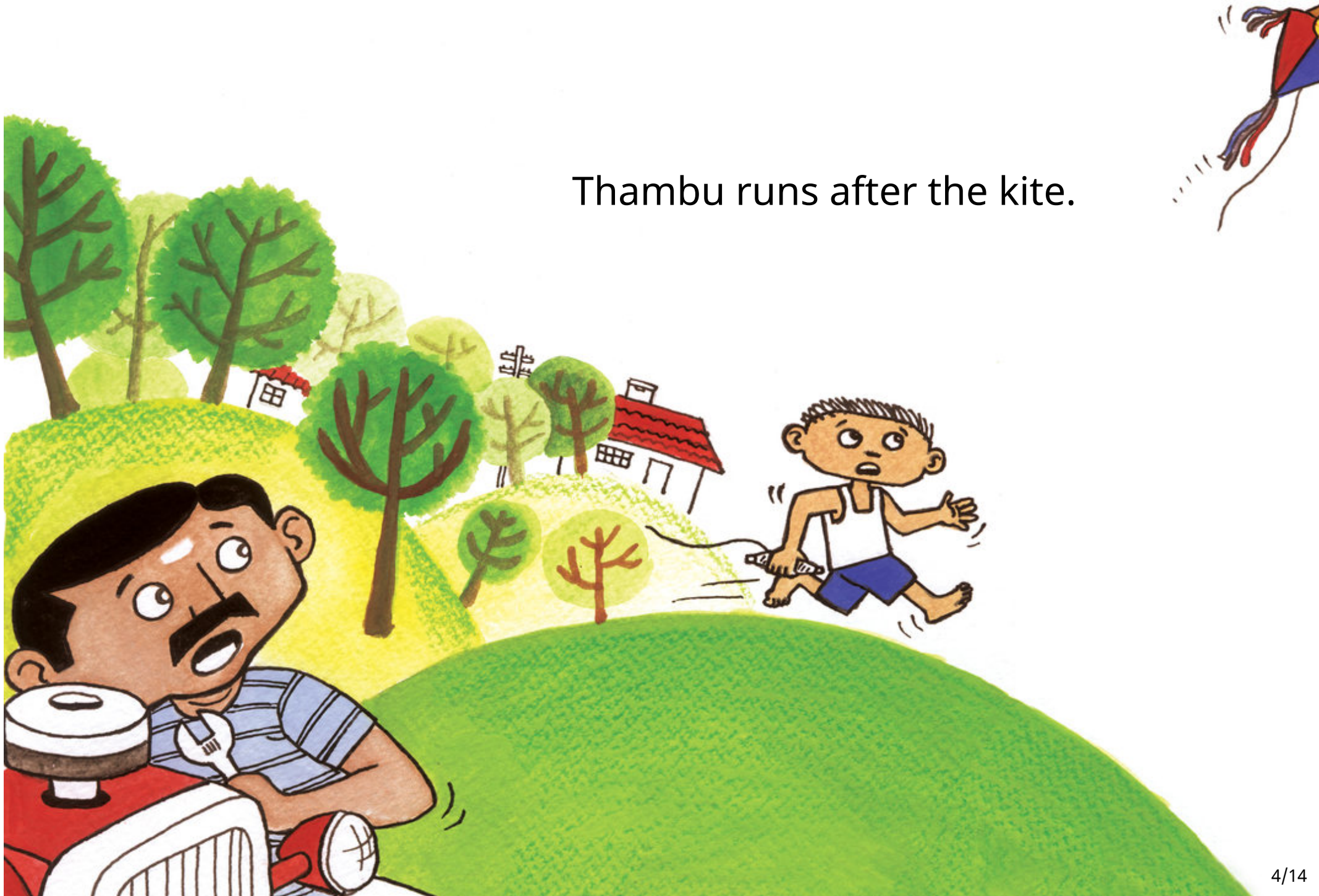


This is Thambu and his family.



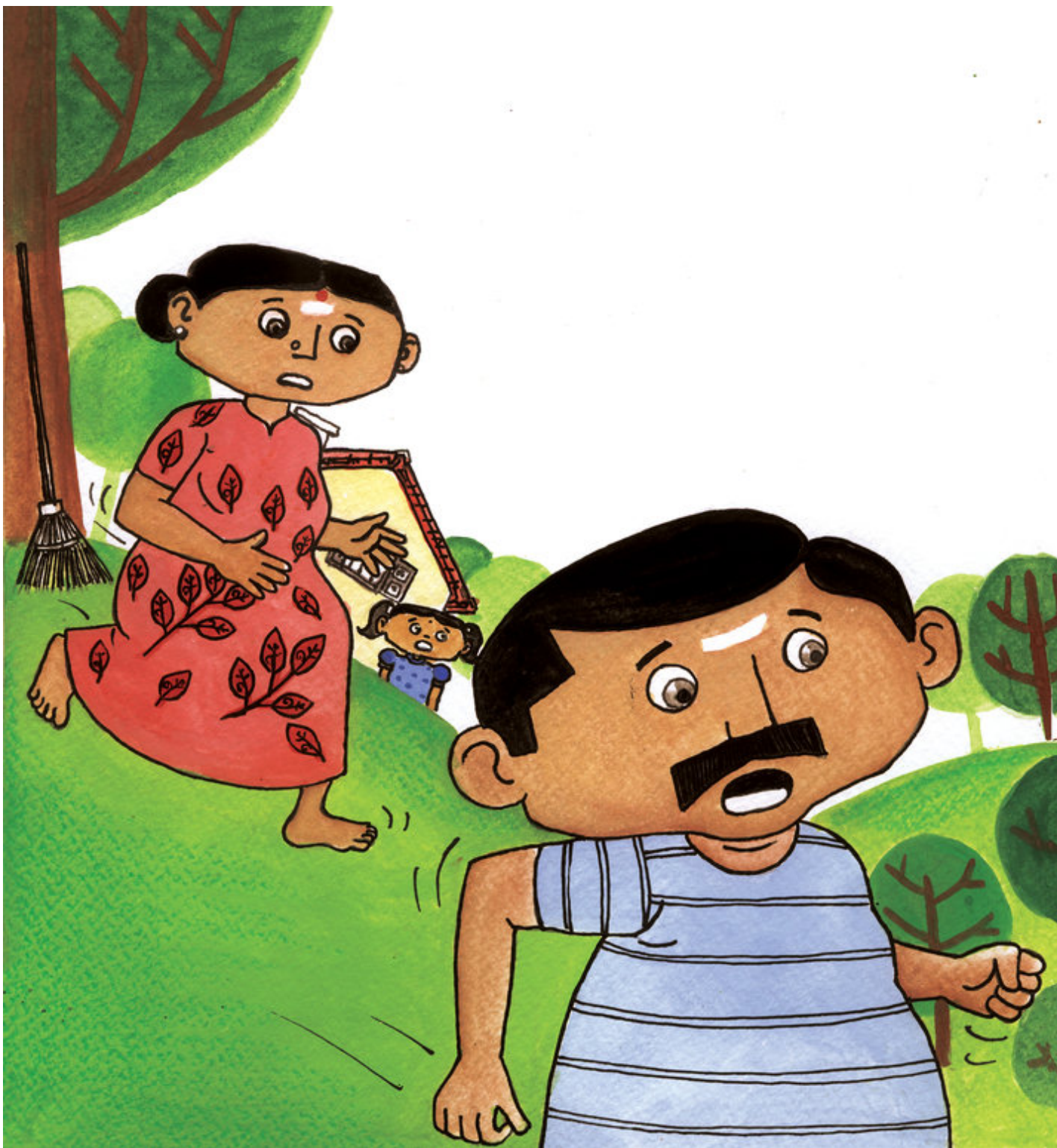
Oh no!
