Shaking her head the crane said, "No, I will not give you my white crown."



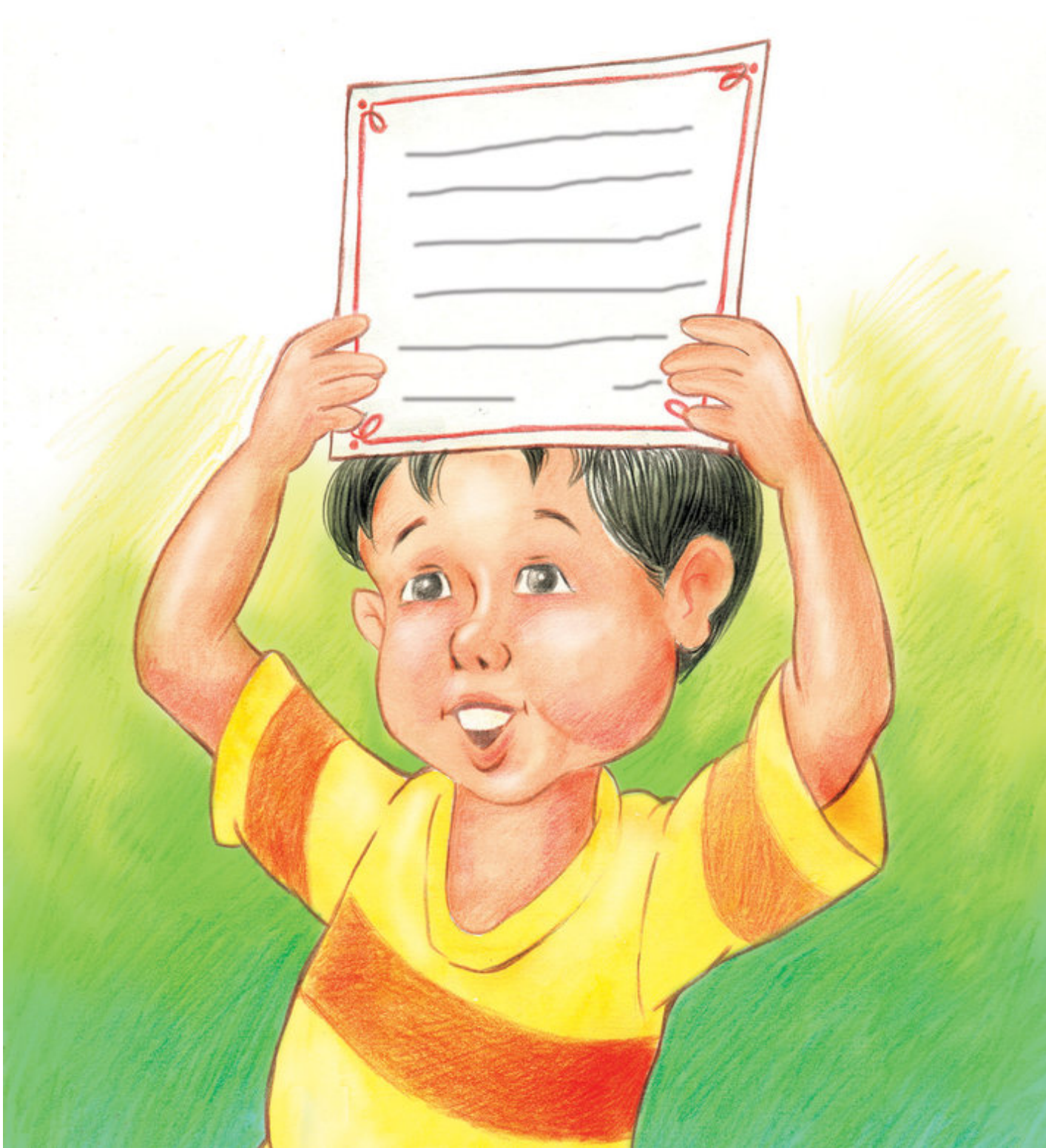


“Enough, rooster,

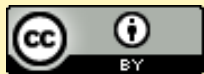
