


The team feels disappointed because the photo Tim took of the mysterious white cat with black stripes is blurry.

Pom-Pom answers, "The only people that come to the forest want to cut down the trees. The trees of the forest are my home. How can you possibly help?"




Deepa says, "No one has ever seen a photo of the mysterious Cat in the Ghat before. If we can take your picture, we can use it to inspire people to protect your habitat."

They want to spread the word to many people about preserving the forests of the Western Ghat.


