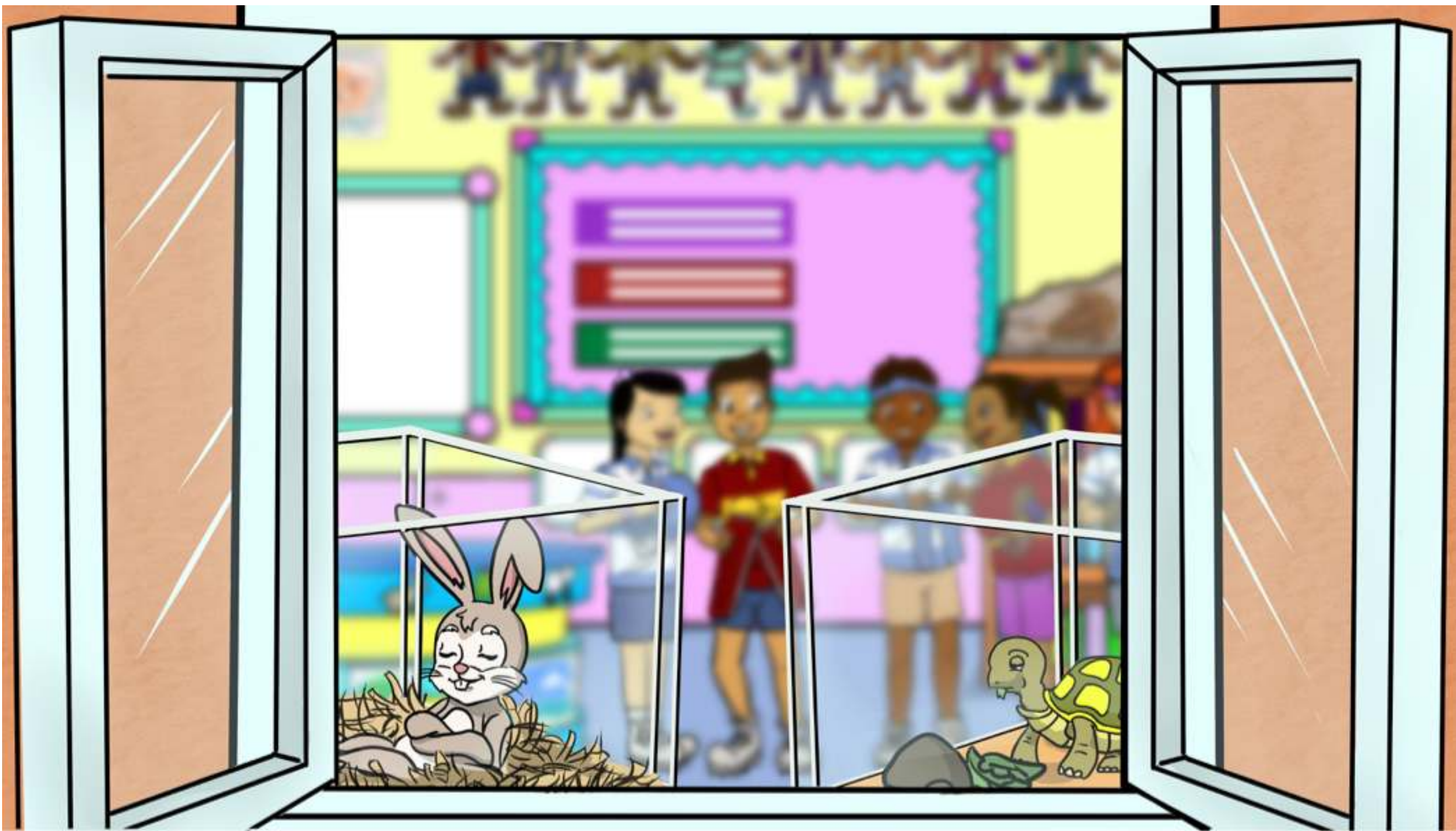




The Turtle and The Rabbit

The animals clapped and cheered for Turtle. Rabbit could not believe that he lost to the slowest animal in the forest.








"Slow and steady wins the race!" cheered the other animals.

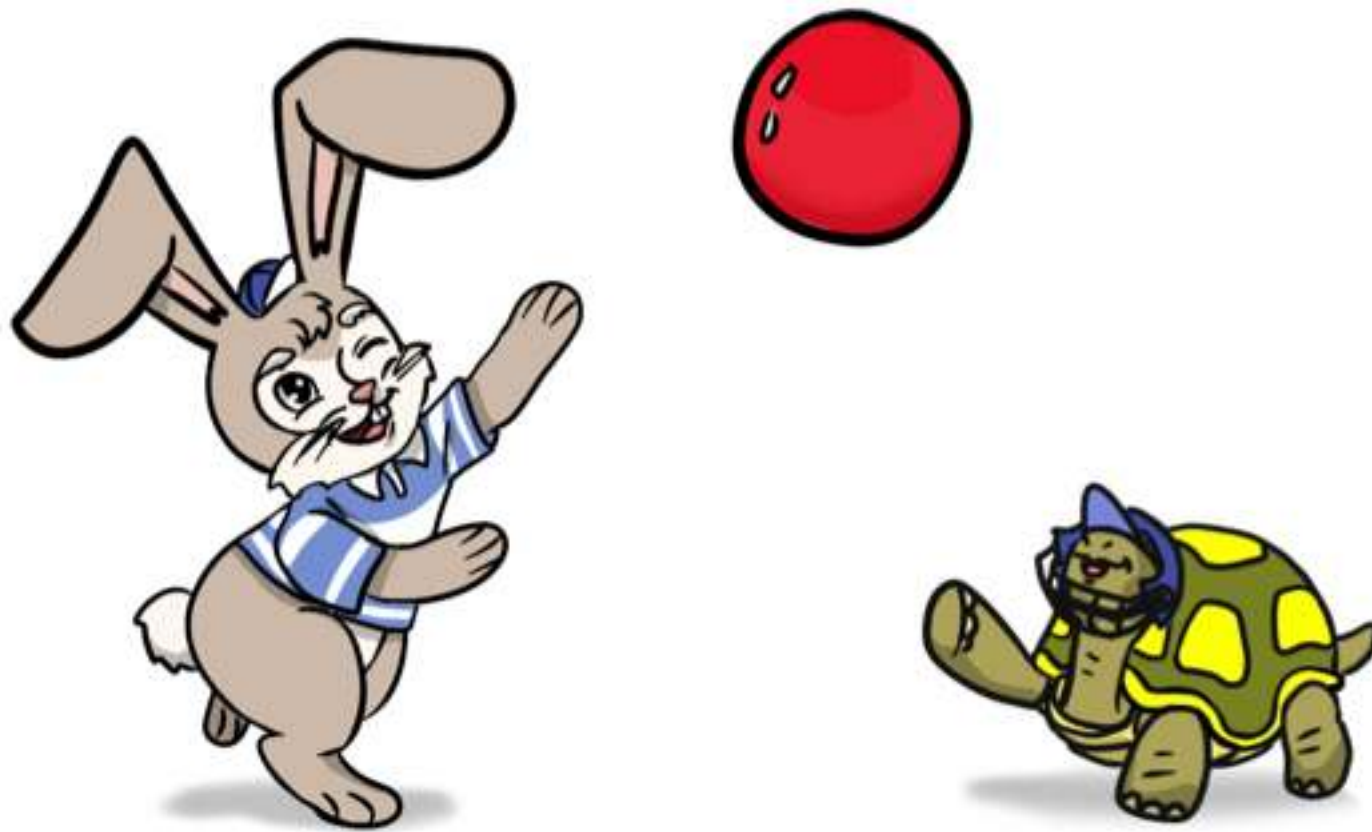
"I learned an important lesson today, congratulations Turtle!" smiled Rabbit.
